


Riversdale Network Principals Conference

Last week, Annabelle Owens and myself attended the Riversdale Network Principals Conference. Apart from it being a chance to work collaboratively with our peers, we were lucky enough to hear from a number of leaders in Education, including Mathematics expert Di Siemon. This year, as a school we are focusing on altering our Maths teaching and learning program to include more struggle time for students and problem solving tasks. Di highlighted the need for struggle time in mathematics to ensure students are able to apply their knowledge and solve multi step problems independently, rather than becoming overly reliant on teachers to provide them with formulaic responses. A good example of this is our Number Talks. I'd encourage your family to have a go at a Number Talk around the dinner table. The focus during a Number Talk is explaining the strategies and reasoning behind your answer and demonstrating that there are many ways to solve a problem, so once you have found one answer, I'd challenge you to find as many more as you can.

Number Talks

Shape	-	Which	shape	does	not	belong?
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Number - There are 12 animal legs on a farm, what animals could live there?

Finally, we finished the conference with a look forward, as Simon Kuestenmacher (The Demographics Group) discussed the workforce of the future and what skills will be most needed. We focussed on the importance of developing student's interpersonal and communication skills as they prepare for a workforce where they may be working from home at least part-time. At CSPS we prioritise collaboration and peer-to-peer learning opportunities in all classrooms and our staff ensure we model these behaviours as we work collaboratively to provide the best possible (and most fun and engaging!) learning experiences for all students.

This week is Education Week and we are celebrating (if the weather allows) with an early start to Assembly on Friday followed by a parents/teachers versus students soccer match. Good luck to our senior students who will be presenting at our Public Speaking Contest at Assembly.
