Outside School Hours

It is lovely to see so many people having a play in the school grounds after school and supporting Saba's canteen. Please ensure you take all your personal belongings home with you as we are experiencing a significant number of incidents with teenagers/young adults accessing the school grounds after hours and causing damage to both school property and items left at school by families.

Smartwatches

We are experiencing an increasing number of issues with students bringing smart watches to school. Teachers are reporting that in class students are receiving text messages which interrupts learning time. We are noticing students are playing games on their watches both during learning time and during recess which is an important time for social skill development. Additionally, a few watches have been misplaced while at school. Please consider if your child really needs to wear a smartwatch to school. As part of our regular cycle of policy review, we will review our Mobile Phones Policy this year to determine if we need to include smart watches within this policy. If you have opinions you would like to share regarding the pros/negatives of smart watches at a primary school please email me so that your views can be taken into consideration.

NAPLAN

We wish our Year 3 and 5 students well as they complete their NAPLAN tests next week. A useful tip for NAPLAN is to ensure that both your iPAD and keyboard are fully charged. Most NAPLAN tests are conducted at the beginning of the school day so it is really important that students arrive on time.

Thank you to the many parent volunteers who have already signed up to help out at the Walkathon. It is a fantastic event and we encourage as many parents as possible to either volunteer (your children love seeing you stamp lap cards) or to come into school to cheer on your children.

As we have previously discussed in the newsletter, teachers are now entitled to time in lieu for attending camp.
